Role

To teach theology courses from an evangelical perspective for the Cambridge Theological Federation with a view to understanding the Christian doctrinal tradition and its historical development (especially in relation to Anglicanism), encouraging at all points rigorous and imaginative integration between theology and practice; to fulfil normal responsibilities of a full-time pastoral tutor at Ridley Hall

Responsibilities

1. Specific Responsibilities

- Teaching and developing, in collaboration with colleagues, introductory level course(s) as well as more advanced courses in Christian Theology, including Biblical Theology

2. General Responsibilities

- Being a pastoral tutor, with pastoral oversight of approximately ten students (responsibilities detailed in the *Ridley Tutors' Handbook*)
- Helping to lead sermon classes
- Attending staff meetings, including residential meetings
- Attending and sharing in the leadership of mandatory College worship and Federation worship, including preaching and giving Bible readings
- Taking part in the interview process for prospective students

3. Teaching

Federation

- Contributing to the development, delivery and assessment of Federation-wide modules (particularly Biblical Theology but also e.g. the introductory module in Christian Belief), according to skills and experience. Current Federation-taught awards include the BTh (given by Cambridge University), the CertHE, DipHE, BA and MA (given by Anglia Ruskin University), and the CTM (given by the Divinity Faculty of Cambridge University).
